

Cumulative Author Index to Proceedings of the Business History Conference, 1954-1988

Introduction

This index comprises all known publications of proceedings of the Business History Conference. Prior to 1975 the proceedings were published on an irregular basis with varying titles and formats. The first volume appeared in 1962. Beginning in 1975 the proceedings were published on a regular basis under the current title, *Business and Economic History*. In addition to the proceedings volumes I have included publications in two issues of the *Business History Review* which resulted from conferences held at Harvard University in 1958 and 1961. Although these were not formally sponsored by the Business History Conference, many of the participants were members. In September 1977 the Business History Conference and the Harvard Graduate School of Business co-sponsored a special conference on the rise of modern business enterprise. Alfred D. Chandler, Jr. and Herman Daems edited the conference papers which were published by Harvard University Press under the title *Managerial Hierarchies* (1980). These papers are included in the index.

I will acknowledge here rather than in the separate citations the editors of the various volumes. Albert K. Steigerwalt edited the 1962 proceedings. J. Van Fenstermaker edited the 1965 proceedings. There was no editor indicated on the proceedings of the 1967 conference published by the University of Western Ontario. Fred Bateman and James D. Foust edited the 1968 proceedings. Charles J. Kennedy edited the proceedings of the conference held in 1969. This was published simultaneously in the *Nebraska Journal of Economics and Business*, Vol. 8, No. 3, (Summer 1969). Louis P. Cain edited the 1972 proceedings, which carries a publication date of 1973. Allen L. Dickes edited the 1973 proceedings. Herman E. Krooss edited the 1974 proceedings, which carries a publication date of 1975. Paul Uselding was responsible for establishing the current format of the journal and assuring its regular appearance. He edited *Business and Economic History* from 1975 through 1980. Jeremy Attack was responsible for greatly enhancing the technical quality of the journal. He edited *Business and Economic History* from 1981 through 1987.

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
